Dear fundholders and community partners,

As many of you know, I joined the GiveWell Community Foundation in April. At the time, our office building was closed, our staff working remotely, and we all were doing our best to understand and react to COVID-19's impact on our families and community. April 1st was by no means a "normal" first day on the job for me, but I was proud to find myself at an organization able to make a real difference in the face of global fear and uncertainty.

Your community foundation acted.

By collaborating with the United Way of Central Florida, we established the United Community Relief Fund to raise funds for those most vulnerable during the pandemic and the nonprofits who were able to provide vital COVID-19 relief services.

Our community stepped up.

Donations poured in, and you helped us raise over \$600,000 - which has been distributed through two rounds of grants in April and September.

As you will read in this annual report, we have many other highlights from this fiscal year to celebrate. We distributed over one thousand grants (more than any other year), totaling over \$23 million, with 86 percent of those grants awarded locally. We also launched the new "Toast" annual celebration of philanthropy for our fundholders and hosted our third annual workshop for nonprofits with agency funds.

I look forward to safely gathering and connecting with you all in-person when it is safe to do so.



- Donor Advised Funds are established by donors who retain the right to recommend grants to nonprofits.
- Agency Funds are created by nonprofits to protect and invest their assets for the future of their work and mission.
- Designated Funds are established to benefit a particular organization or project.
- Community Funds allow municipalities, local service clubs, and community groups to improve quality of life of our area.
- Legacy Funds allow donors to leave a legacy of giving by incorporating charitable giving into their estate plans.

- Memorial Funds honor a loved one by supporting causes or nonprofits which would have pleased that person.
- Field of Interest Funds create a resource to target an area of interest to the donor, such as education or arts and culture.
- Scholarship Funds help students at a specific school or in a particular curriculum in furthering their education.
- GWCF Unrestricted Fund enables GWCF to address current community needs and allows the public to participate by pooling donations.



Grants By Type



Anticipating COVID-19's effect on our communities, GiveWell Community Foundation partnered with United Way of Central Florida in March 2020 to establish the United Community Relief Fund. The Fund would support nonprofit organizations throughout Polk, Hardee, and Highlands counties who are serving those most vulnerable to the health and economic impact of the global pandemic.

GiveWell Community Foundation and United Way collaborated to raise funds and awareness, assess community needs, and distribute grants to organizations selected by a committee of volunteer leaders.

Initial grants from the United Community Relief Fund were distributed in April. 34 local nonprofit organizations received a total of \$310,056.27. Funding priorities included food distribution, shelter assistance, childcare for essential workers, and personal protective and other health equipment.

At the time of publishing this report, additional grants have been distributed from the United Community Relief Fund for COVID-19-related needs. In September, \$300,740.19 was distributed to 33 nonprofits in September. So far, over \$600,000 has been raised and distributed for COVID-19 relief.
